2021-2022 FBLA ARIZONA – CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAM MEMBERSHIP

What is the Co-Curricular Program Membership Plan?

The Co-Curricular Program Membership Plan allows students who are enrolled in a Business, Media, and/or Information Technology program to be eligible for the benefits and opportunities of FBLA as a part of the total program delivery. This plan also focuses on the development of essential employability, participative and attitude development skills as called for in the U.S. Department of Labor's Secretary's Commission on Achieving Necessary Skills (SCANS) Report.

Under the Co-Curricular Program Plan, all students are FBLA members. All students in the local Business Education, Media, and/or Information Technology programs are simply signed up using a fee schedule according to membership numbers.

How Does the Co-Curricular Program Plan Work?

For a flat fee in a single Business Education, Media, and/or Information Technology program, join FBLA Arizona under a fee based on student enrollment in your current classes. **Invoices for membership will be emailed to you from National FBLA-PBL**, and all payments need to be mailed to: FBLA-PBL; P.O. Box 79063; Baltimore, MD 21279.

- ♦ All students will be eligible to participate in all nationally sponsored FBLA activities

- ♦ Chapter site visits from state adviser, FBLA State Officers, and program supervisors

How is pricing calculated for Co-Curricular Membership?

Pricing is based on the Business, Media and/or Information Technology program enrollment submitted by your school for the current year. Enrollment numbers are determined by what your school submitted to the Arizona Department of Education/CTE Division. All schools fit within one of the following categories. Schools that have a limited number of students, please contact the State Office for pricing.

• Submitting your Membership. You will submit your membership on the National website. If your school has multiple chapters, you will need to register them with Nationals SEPARATELY; however, the state will consider you one chapter and you can have the option to be added as one chapter for enrollment pricing. You will need to let the state know how you would like your membership billed. This will be an added question to your Program of Work.

How do I Register my Students for FBLA Membership?

- Go to FBLA-PBL.org.
- Login using your email and password you have created. IF you do not remember your password, click on the Forgot your password and the button to reset your password. If you still can't get in, contact the state office.
- Go to the Adviser button and then click on the blue box that says Manage your Chapter.
- Click on Renew your Arizona Chapter and select the membership tier level from our Arizona tier chart <u>NOT</u> the drop down chooses as some of those are not available to Arizona and we will have to go in and change those if you choose the wrong one.
- After you choose your tier level, click on Purchase for my school AZ click here button and next.
- Once you hit submit, you will receive an invoice in your email. This invoice will be for the membership tier level you are choosing **NOT** individual student membership.
- After you have done this, you should be able to input your students.

Please Note: Click on the steps to verify correct information is provided for school and adviser.

There is no professional division this year with nationals. More information will come directly from them on this.

Once you choose your membership tier level, you will receive an invoice in your email. Remember, you are paying for the Tier level NOT individual student memberships. Please mail payment to the national office NOT the state office.









FBLA ARIZONA CHAPTER AWARDS

Based on the addition of a CTSO for an approved CTE program, each FBLA Chapter is required to reach the Bronze Chapter Award. This program is designed to provide recognition for our Chapters while ensuring that our membership is strong and active. All documentation for awards will be due on **March 17**. Go to azfbla.org website, under **Adviser Resources**.

Bronze Chapter (required for all Chapters)

- Local Chapter Constitution/Bylaws on record with State Office.
- 2. Minimum membership requirements (currently five paid members).
- 3. Provide list of Local Officers along with email addresses to State Office.
- 4. Submit Program of Work (POW) to State Office.
- 5. Hold at least four meetings per school year (submit minutes).

Bronze Level Chapters will receive an official certificate and their name will be listed on the FBLA Arizona website.

Silver Chapter (Bronze Level plus the activities below)

- Attend at least two FBLA Arizona events.
- 2. Have at least 10% of members achieve a Business Achievement Award. Each level will count as one student.
- 3. Conduct a Chapter Community Service Project.
- 4. Officer team creates a Chapter Budget.
- Complete an FBLA scrapbook and enter into State Leadership Conference (SLC) competition. (Can be an electronic scrapbook.)

Silver level chapters will receive an official certificate, their chapter name on our website, and Silver Chapter ribbons at the SLC.

Gold Chapter (Silver Level plus the activities below)

- 1. Recruit a school administrator to attend a local or state FBLA event.
- Have at least 25% of members achieve a Business Achievement Award. Each level will count as one student.
- 3. Conduct at least one FBLA PR presentation (school board, civic group, etc.).
- Complete one of the following National FBLA Chapter Awards. Go here http://www.fbla-pbl.org/fbla/programs/recognition-awards/:
 - a. Chapter Challenge: Super Sweeps, Non-Stop November, and Action Awareness
 - b. Big Ten
 - c. 100 Percent Class Participation
 - d. Membership Achievement Award
 - e. FBLA Outstanding Chapter
- 5. Chapter contributes \$100 to the FBLA Arizona Scholarship fund or \$175 to the Sponsorship fund to sponsor and present one objective test event at State Leadership Conference. Gold Level Chapters will receive a plaque presentation at the State Leadership Conference, Gold Chapter ribbons, reserved seating at SLC Closing Session, and an entry as a Gold Seal Chapter at the National level.

LEAD AWARDS

The LEAD Awards are an individual achievement award program for FBLA-Middle Level members. Participating members have the opportunity to enhance their leadership skills, expand their business knowledge, contribute to their local communities, and earn recognition by immersing themselves in their school and communities. There are two levels to the LEAD Award.

- LEAD Explore Award Members are introduced to the foundations of FBLA, learn
 how to best take advantage of the opportunities available to them, and develop
 their leadership skills.
- LEAD Aspire Award Members have the opportunity to select a business skill or content area that they would like to further develop. Once they complete a given program within the Aspire level, members have the choice of selecting a new business skill or concept to earn an additional award.

FBLA NATIONAL COMPETITIVE EVENT CHANGES FOR 2021-2022

FBLA MIDDLE LEVEL

The National Awards Program, also known as competitive events, recognizes and rewards excellence in a broad range of business and career-related areas. FBLA-Middle Level competitive events also prepare students for successful careers in business by providing opportunities to apply classroom concepts in a workforce-simulated competitive environment.

NEW EVENT

Annual Chapter Activities Presentation will be a chapter event, with a presentation team of one to three members from the chapter. The chapter will present an account of their activities from the close of the previous National Leadership Conference through the conclusion of the current State Leadership Conference.

Business Ethics will be an individual/team objective test event and a case study to be presented to judges.

Career Research will be an individual presentation event. Members will conduct research on a career of their choice and present information related to the

Exploring Business Issues will be an individual or team presentation event, with teams of two to three members. Members will receive a topic to research and present their findings during the presentation.

Exploring Economics will be an individual objective test event.

Exploring Technology will be an individual objective test event.

FBLA Concepts will be an individual objective test event.

FBLA Mission & Pledge will be an individual presentation event. Members will recite and reflect on the FBLA mission and pledge.

Interpersonal Communication will be an individual objective test event.

Leadership will be an individual objective test event.

Learning Strategies will be an individual objective test event.

Marketing Mix Challenge will be an individual or team presentation event, with teams of two to three members. Members will create a marketing plan for a product/service that includes integration of the five Ps of the marketing mix with promotional materials as part of the presentation.

Running an Effective Meeting will be an individual objective test event.

Video Game Challenge will be an individual or team demonstration event, with teams of two to three members. Members will create a video game based on a published topic and will demonstrate the video game and its usability and functionality.

FBLA NATIONAL COMPETITIVE EVENT CHANGES FOR 2021-2022

MODIFICATION

Business Math & Financial Literacy will now be named Financial Literacy and the business math concepts will be eliminated from the event. The competencies and tasks will be rewritten to reflect the new intent of the event. The event will remain an individual objective test.

Introduction to Computer Science & Coding will now be named Exploring Computer Science and the coding concepts will be eliminated from the event. The competencies and tasks will be rewritten to reflect the new intent of the event. The event will remain an individual objective test.

Multimedia & Website Development will now be an individual or team demonstration event, with teams of two to three members. Additionally, the event will be modified to become a demonstration event where the project will be demonstrated directly to the judges to show its usability and functionality. The project will no longer be prejudged, and the objective test will be eliminated.

NAME CHANGE

Community Service Project will be renamed Community Service Presentation.


